**Author of “Apache Voices”**

Sherry Robinson is a long time New Mexico journalist and author. She began her career in 1975 as the Navajo Nation stringer for the Gallup Independent. She’s worked for newspapers and television and was also science writer at the University of New Mexico, editing the award-winning research magazine, Quantum. In 1997 she received a Woman on the Move award from the YWCA in Albuquerque. She was named Woman of Achievement in 1980 by New Mexico Press Women. In 2003 she was an Honorary Commander at Kirtland Air Force Base. She has won writing awards from ten communications organizations. She’s given talks about the Apaches as a speaker for the New Mexico Humanities Council since 1999.

Robinson is a Colorado native who has lived in New Mexico since 1975 and is a graduate of the University of New Mexico.
